The Bank of Canada 1935 \$20 Banknote

When the Bank of Canada opened for business on March 11, 1935, it issued its own notes in denominations of \$1, \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100, \$500 and \$1000. These banknotes are the first and only series to have two separate notes per denomination, one for each of Canada's official languages. As might be expected, most of the French notes were sent to the Bank of Canada agency in Montreal, although most other agencies received a small amount of French notes as well.



This portrait of Princess Elizabeth appeared on the Canadian 20-dollar note. The note was issued with English text (No. 46) and French text (No.47). The original portrait was taken by Marcus Adams, who was the official photographer to the Royal children. The

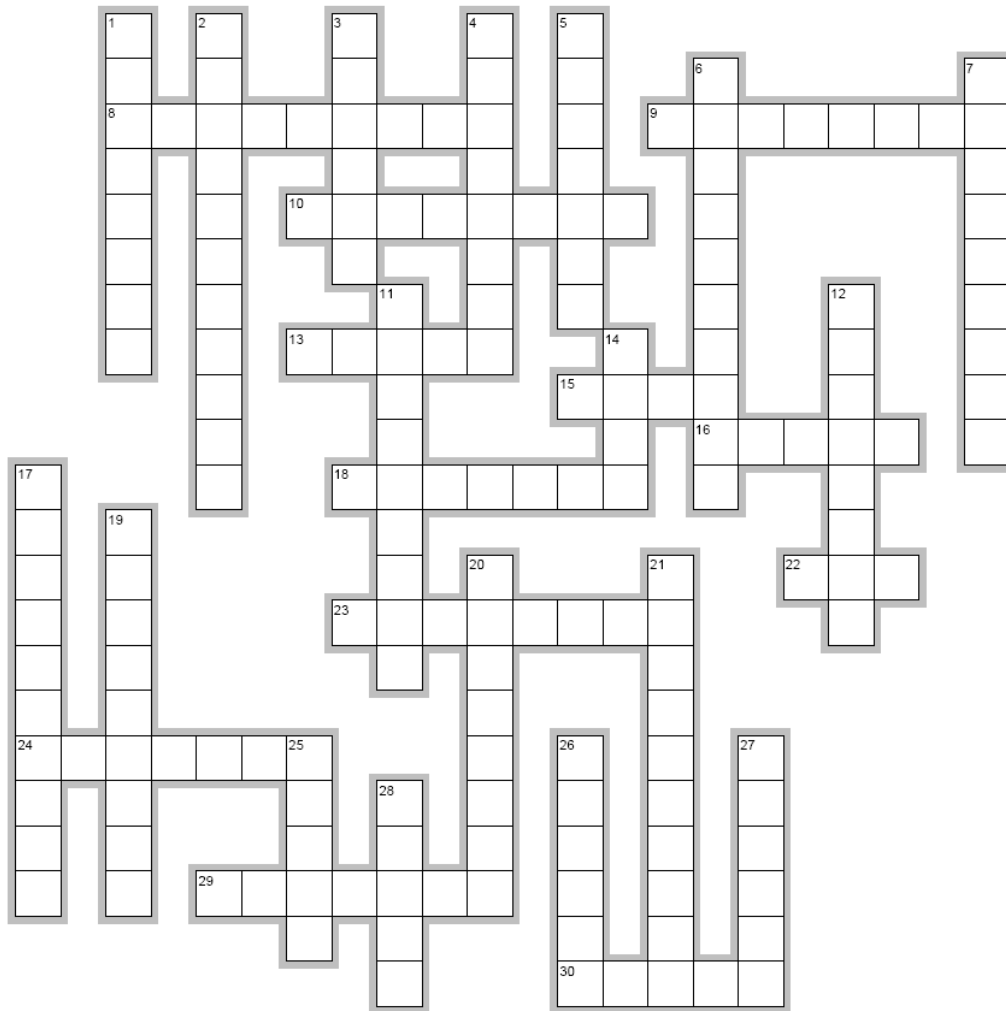
image on the banknotes was engraved by Edwin Gunn who was employed by the Canadian Banknote Company Limited.

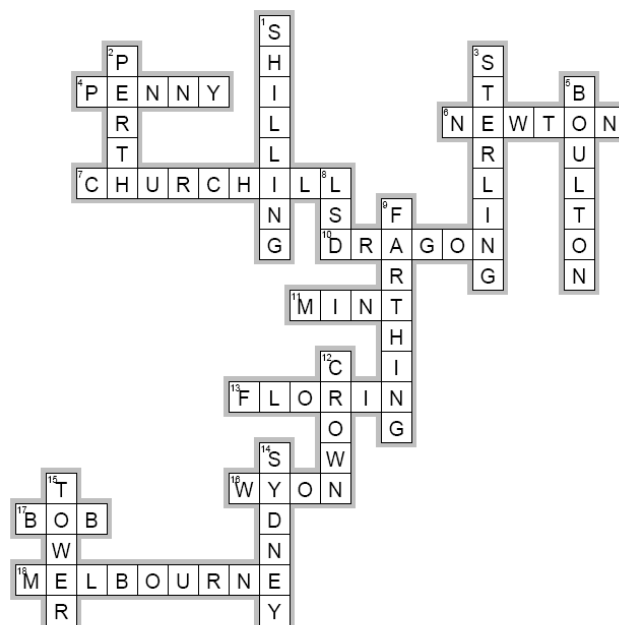
