Club Members at the Meeting

I was the first speaker of the year, and I presented information from the United States Mint Forum I attended in Philadelphia, PA on October 13, 2016. I was a member of the four person ANA team. Attending with me at the mint forum from the ANA were: ANA President Jeff Garrett, ANA Executive Director Kim Kiick, and ANA Membership Director Cary Hardy.

The first four hours of the mint forum had United States Mint employees presenting a lot of information on coinage production, costs, and sale trends. I condensed the four hours into about a 45 minute presentation.

The following information in the table below is from the United States Mint, 2015 data. At the mint forum there was discussion on the seigniorage of the circulating coinage. Seigniorage is the government's profit on a coin from the difference between its face value and the cost to make a coin. This value should be positive, a profit, not negative, a loss. 2015 data was the last full completed year before the October 13, 2016 meeting.

In 2015, the United States Mint had 64% of their circulating coinage production losing money!

I also showed a number of charts produced by the United States Mint showing a loss of sales, revenue and collectors over the past ten years or so. As metal (nickel, copper, and zinc) costs rise, the United States Mint loss will increase.
