

MY FIRST COIN SHOW ROBBERY

Most people never think about the possibility of being robbed. Being robbed was the farthest thought from my mind as I went into the Gadsden, Alabama Mall to set up as a coin dealer.

The Mall was hosting one of three annual coin shows sponsored by the Gadsden Coin Club, which has been having coin shows at the Gadsden Mall for over 15 years without any incident.

This particular weekend last October I decided to set up a couple of tables to buy and sell all types of numismatic items. I wanted to sell my duplicate coins, currency, space medals, and unusual tokens, and the coin show was a good venue to accomplish my goal.

As the two-day show was coming to an end on that Saturday afternoon around 3:00 p.m., I decided to pack up my inventory from the tables, load my car, and head for home.

The show had been successful for me as I sold over \$2,000 worth of everything I had displayed on my tables. I placed the cash and my unsold items, which included three foreign gold pieces, in my black briefcase.

I exited the mall to where my car was parked a short distance from the Mall entrance, and placed the briefcase behind the driver's seat. Then I put my jacket over the briefcase so no one could look into the car and see the briefcase.

I went back into the Mall for about ten minutes and returned to my car. To my shock my car was surrounded by two Gadsden Police cars and three uniformed policemen. The red lights on the police cars were flashing.

With my heart pounding, I asked the nearest policeman what was going on. He pointed to my car and showed me the right rear window had been smashed out. Someone had reached into the car, unlocked all the doors, grabbed my briefcase and fled. All this while my car alarm was going off. And no one heard it.

The policeman said that the robbers had evidently been watching me as I left the show and saw me place the briefcase behind the driver's seat. It all happened so fast. I was stunned. This was the first time I had ever been robbed and I was getting mad.

The policeman making the report asked about the contents in my briefcase. I could not think clearly and told him I would get back to him by Monday with the information he wanted. It had happened so fast.

Fortunately, several years ago I purchased coin insurance that covered my coins while travelling and also in my home. I filed a claim for the lost coins in my briefcase and the insurance paid off within a couple of weeks. An excellent experience with an insurance company. My homeowners insurance covered my cash loss but only for about 15% of the amount taken. If you have coins I recommend a separate coin policy.

Overall, I recovered about 70% of my loss, which is better than nothing. But I certainly learned some important lessons from this robbery.

- 1.) Be aware that someone could be watching you at a coin show even though you are not a dealer.
- 2.) Once you place your coins in the car then leave and don't return to the show for anything.
- 3.) While you are driving be sure to watch to make sure no one is following you.
- 4.) Have a pistol in your car while you drive for protection.

I returned to the Gadsden Mall a couple of weeks ago for their Spring Coin Show and set up a couple of tables. This time I did not have any issues or problems as I recalled the lessons I had learned from my first coin show robbery.
