WHAT ARE GIORI PRESS TEST NOTES?

During a recent visit to my son Jon's office in Murfreesboro, TN, he opened his desk drawer and pulled out an interesting numismatic item. A PCGS certified Giori press notes. He had found these on a currency website and purchased them for his numismatic collection.

What are Giori Press test notes? I came home, turned on my computer, and Googled "Giori Press Test Notes". Never having heard of them I was interested in my findings. After WW II an Italian by the name of Gualtiero Giori invented the printing process.

Our paper money is currently printed by the Bureau of Printing and Engraving (BEP) in Washington, D.C. and Ft. Worth, Texas. The presses they use require a pass for each color. Green ink for the backs



and Black ink for the front. As you can imagine this is a time-consuming task.

In the 1970's the BEP contacted the American Bank Note Company and asked them to find a new type press that would improve the BEP's printing process and modernize their machinery.

The American Bank Note Company contacted an engineer, Mr. Edgar Pigman, working for the American Can Company in Geneva, NY to design a new press. The new presses were shipped to Washington, D.C. and created a number of test sheets using plates from the BEP.

What made the Giori Press unique is that it could print 2-color or 3-color at the same time. This was done by using precisely cut rubber ink rollers that allowed each ink to parts of the same plate.

The plates had vignettes of Presidents Washington, Lincoln, and Grant identical to those used on the \$1, \$5, and \$50 Federal Reserve Notes. These test notes had cancel lines across them so they could note be used in any illegal manner. The BEP made the test notes illegal for collectors to own, but later lifted the restriction. The new press project was eventually scrapped.

A hoard of test notes were recently found in the estate of Edgar Pigman by his nephew. The entire hoard was sold to a dealer in NY and he submitted them to PCGS for grading and certification. I was unable to find any reference to quantity in the hoard. Some notes can be found on E-Bay.

As a side note, the BEP did use the Giori Press for the printing of a multicolored postage stamp in 1962 for "Project Mercury". This stamp was printed in secret and was not revealed until Astronaut John Glenn made his famous 3 orbits on February 20, 1962. This was the first time the post office issued a commemorative stamp on the day of the event it commemorated.




