## £1 Coin Series "Shipbuilding in Jersey in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century"

During the nineteenth century Jersey enjoyed great economic expansion, largely due to the important influence of the shipbuilding industry. To salute this age-old craft the Royal Mint was commissioned to strike a series of seven one Pound coins. Six of the coins depict locally built vessels while a seventh bears a representation of the official seal of the Bailiwick in use from 1844 to 1870. The choice of ships was determined to show the great diversity of ship building in the States.

They are:the *Tickler* (a schooner),

- the Percy Douglas (a vintage full rigged ship),
- the Hebe (a brig),
- the Bailiwick Seal,
- the Gemini (a barque),
- the Century (a brigantine), and

the *Resolute* (a top sail schooner)

#### Things to note about these coins:

- The reverse of each coin is the work of Royal Mint engraver Robert Evans.
- An edge inscription CAESAREA INSULA, the name given to the island by the Roman Antonius in AD 300, meaning "Island of Jersey" also features on all of these one pound coins.
- Proof coins containing 11.68 grams of silver and had a maximum mintage of 3,000.

#### 19th Century Shipbuilding in Jersey

I have been exploring the possibility of introducing a £1 coin series featuring craft built in local yards in the 19th Century and prior to submitting a paper to the Finance and Economics Committee, for acceptance in principle, I considered it advisable to discuss the matter.

Examples of the craft built locally are shown on the attached enclosure and I am in possession of drawings of three - the Topsail Schooner, the Lugger and the Smack. Before further investigations are carried out I would be pleased to know the reactions of your designers. The dimensions of the £1 coin are very restricting and it may be difficult to feature craft of this size.







The first coin in the series depicts a schooner, the *Tickler*. This two masted schooner was built in Jersey in 1858 for the Le Boutilier Company.

The *Tickler* with a weight of 93 tons, measured 93 feet long, had a beam of 19 feet and drew some 10 feet of water. She plied the trade routes of northern Europe and the Mediterranean, with occasional voyages to Newfoundland. After ten years in service, the *Tickler* was mortgaged with the Jersey Joint Stock Bank and was subsequently sold to Charles Robin and Company. Some three years later Robin and Company, a principal ship owning company on the island took control of the *Tickler*. Because of financial difficulties the schooner, along with other vessels, was sold to France in 1888. She was last mentioned in the Lloyd's List in 1864.

#### Things to note:

- 10,000 circulation coins were minted via Work Order 340 Amendment 2.
- There were a total of 227 gold proof coins minted. The maximum allowed of 3000 silver proof coins were also minted.
- With the Royal Mint selling 167 gold and 2,550 silver coins along with Jersey's order of 37 gold and 450 silver, the total number of coins surviving is 204 gold and 3000 silver.






#### **Gracious Gift from the Jaques Family**






Books Donated by the Jaques Family


