Also, I have to mention that our YOUNGEST member, Aaron Wales, will be presenting in April. I'm looking forward to it! Doug **£1 Coin Series "The Percy Douglas"** By H.K. Fears

This month we continue our journey on Jersey's ship building series with a review of the Percy Douglas coin.

This coin, the second in the series, features the Percy Douglas, a 781 ton ship. She was originally laid down by Edward Allen of St Aubin at his yard which was situated just behind where the current Parish Hall stands. This was to be his sixth vessel. Allen was declared bankrupt, and the court awarded the half-completed hull to his chief creditor, a Liverpudlian entrepreneur, Thomas Hayley, described as 'a gentleman', who lived at Hillside, Beaumont. Hayley had the vessel moved along the beach closer to his house at Beaumont and engaged a shipwright who then oversaw the completion of the ship. She was launched on 8 August 1861 and was named after the Lieutenant Governor of the day - Major General Sir Robert Percy Douglas. She was




172ft 3ins long, 32ft 3ins in the beam and had a depth 19ft 9ins. She was registered in Liverpool the same day as she was launched and for the first four years her master was JP Hamon. She worked the Australia, Far Eastern and China routes until she was wrecked on the Kishma Shoal two days out of Rangoon on 30th December 1871. The entire crew was drowned including her master, Captain F Le Riche.

Things to note about these coins:

- Only 20,000 circulation strike coins were minted
- Initially, there was a total of 225 gold proof coins minted and the maximum allowed of 3000 silver proof coins were also minted.
- However, with the Royal Mint selling 98 gold and 2,409 silver coins along with Jersey's order of 35 gold and 450 silver, the total number of coins surviving is 133 gold and 2859 silver. The others were melted.

This 1794 Flowing Hair Dollar sold in a private transaction earlier this year for \$12 million, becoming the second-most-expensive individual coin to sell. Only about 140 silver dollars exist today out of the original mintage of 1,758, and this is the only example designated Specimen by Professional Coin Grading Service (PCGS), which assigned a grade of SP66.
