Jersey £1 Coin Ship Series "Gemini"

The next coin on our cruise of the Jersey ship series features the *Gemini*. The *Gemini* was a three-masted barque built by Daniel Le Vesconte of First Tower for Messrs. Deslandes and Pallot. The *Gemini* was registered as 430 tons and launched on 7 May 1864, making voyages to China, South America, the West Indies, and New York. Records indicate that the crew was paid 2.5 pounds per month and the mate received no less than 5 pounds. She was eventually broken up in Singapore in 1880 after being declared unseaworthy. However, some experts believe that after a name change, it sailed for many more years.

Things to note about this coin:

- Only 20,000 circulation coins were minted.
- There was a total of 126 gold proof coins minted. The maximum allowed of 3000 silver proof coins were also minted.

My 1953 New Zealand Proof Set

Recently, I purchased a 1953 proof set from New Zealand. The set was issued from the coronation year of Queen Elizabeth. The Royal Mint's 84th Annual Report of the Deputy Master and Comptroller states:

"New Zealand - 250,000 crowns, 120,000 halfcrowns, 250,000 florins, 200,000 shillings, 1,200,000 sixpences, 4,000,000 threepences, 2,400,000 pennies and 120,000 halfpence were struck.

All bore on the obverse the uncrowned effigy of Her Majesty by Mrs. Gillick, O.B.E., together with the inscription "QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND". The reverse designs of the denominations from the halfpenny to the halfcrown were unchanged, but the reverse design of the crown was new.

It consisted of a Maori carving, surmounted by the crowned Royal Cypher, all between five-pointed stars, representing the Southern Cross, and the inscription "NEW ZEALAND CROWN 1953". Mr. T.H. Paget modeled the design in plaster according to a drawing from New Zealand. The design is illustrated in Plate A, Fig. 9.

7,000 specimen sets of all denominations were also supplied in cases."

Each obverse features the laureate bust of young Queen Elizabeth II facing right.



The halfpenny reverse shows a hei-tiki (Maori charm), with ornamental scrolls to either side.



The penny reverse shows a tui bird perched on a blossoming kowhai branch.



The reverse design shows two crossed patu (carved Maori weapons) with thong wrist straps.



The reverse design shows a huia bird, (now extinct), perched on a branch.



The reverse design shows a crouching Maori warrior, holding a taiaha (staff weapon).



The reverse design shows a foraging kiwi (nocturnal, flightless bird).



The reverse shows the NZ Shield of Arms with Maori designs, the Southern Cross, a sheaf of wheat, a lamb suspended by a ribbon, and mining hammers, with 3 ships in between. Above is the royal crown.



The reverse shows Elizabeth's royal monogram, (E II R), with the royal crown above, and a Maori design below. The Southern Cross frames the main design.

Charles Eugene Cataldo, Jr. departed from this life suddenly on June 10, 2022, at the age of 66. He was born in Huntsville to Charles Eugene Cataldo, Sr. and JoAnn Jacks Cataldo. Mr. Calaldo was the owner of Alabama Coin and Silver Company located in Huntsville since 1975. He bought the business at the age of 19. As a numismatist, he developed strong relationships with his customers and clients, that have lasted decades. Mr. and Mrs. Cataldo traveled the United States extensively attending coin shows. His studies and research made him renowned throughout the coin dealer community. Later in life, he taught Numismatics and Early North American Artifacts at The University of Alabama in Huntsville. Mr. Cataldo wrote two books on coins and paper money. Above all his accomplishments in business he was the proudest of being a husband and father.
