V. Kurt Bellman Receives **Major ANA Award at**

131st ANA World's Fair of Money

Madison County Coin Club vice president V. Kurt Bellman received the American Numismatic Association's (ANA) Glenn Smedley award at the 131st ANA World's Fair of Money held in the Chicago area at the Rosemont Convention Center, Rosemont, IL. His award was presented to him during the Member & Awards Celebration Program on Thursday, August 18, 2022. The Glenn Smedley award is one of the major ANA awards that an ANA member can receive from the organization.

The award citation for V. Kurt Bellman reads:

"An exhibit builder and ANA exhibit judge, Bellman became an ANA National Volunteer in 2013 and has presented five "Money Talks" lectures at ANA conventions on a range of topics. He was invited to join the U.S. Mint's program development forum in 2016 and participated in the formation of the American Innovation Dollar Coin Program[™]. Bellman is a recipient of the Boling Award for Judging Excellence and was honored as a Numismatic Point of Light in 2014."

Per the ANA web site www.money.org/service-awards-categories, the purpose and criteria of the Glenn Smedley award are:

PURPOSE

The Glenn Smedley Memorial Award was created in memory of Glenn B. Smedley, a collector's collector, to recognize individuals who have devoted their efforts to the betterment of the ANA.

CRITERIA

The nominee should be an individual involved in volunteer service to the ANA either on a local, regional or national level. A Nominee should exhibit a positive attitude, strong communication skills, cooperation, and dependability. The nominee must also be a member of the ANA.

Congratulations to Kurt Bellman on receiving the award, and his dedication to the ANA and hobby with the contributions he has made over many years.

The Jersey 2004 £1 Commemorative Banknote

The Island of Jersey had a unique way of remembering the 800th anniversary of their self-determination in the form of a £1 banknote. The new notes were issued from Monday 10th May, 2004.

The printing of the £1 banknote is divided into two main areas, each drawing on elements of the anniversary. The note features Mont Orgueil Castle as the main image and also includes the 1204-2004 logo, featured above the castle. The printing includes the crest of Jersey, featuring the three lions; a detail from the original charter of 1341 confirming the island's privileges by Edward III; the silver-gilt mace, presented to the Bailiff as a perpetual reminder of his fidelity to King Charles II; the original seal that was granted to the Bailiwick of Jersey in 1279 by King Edward I and medieval figures capturing the revelry of the anniversary celebrations.

Further features of the new banknote include the use of gold ink for the denomination in the top right corner; the printing of the commemorative logo in red and gold and the inclusion of a three character numbering prefix 'J8C' to signify Jersey 800.

Nigel Quérée Chairman of the 1204-2004 celebrations said: 'We are very grateful to the Finance & Economics Committee for supporting the celebrations through the issue of this commemorative £1 note. The note will act as a reminder of this special year and we are sure that many will be kept as a souvenir, by locals and visitors alike. We are issuing a special presentation pack, which will be available on our website, of the low numbered notes for collectors.'





The Jersey pound that commemorates the 800th anniversary of the relationship between Jersey and the British crown. Its front side contains two treecreepers, a Jersey 1204-2004 overprint near the watermark area, the Coat of Arms of Jersey with the three lions passant guardant, and Queen Elizabeth II. Its back side contains the Jersey 1204-2004 overprint, a mace, a coin, a bugler, and a view of Mont Orgueil castle. The note has a solid security thread and a watermark of a Jersey cow head. Its dimensions are 128 mm by 65 mm.
