- One Bank Town...One Bank County
- Amount Issued...Amount Outstanding
- Number of Years Bank Active...Year Liquidated or in Receivership (the Earlier, the Scarcer)

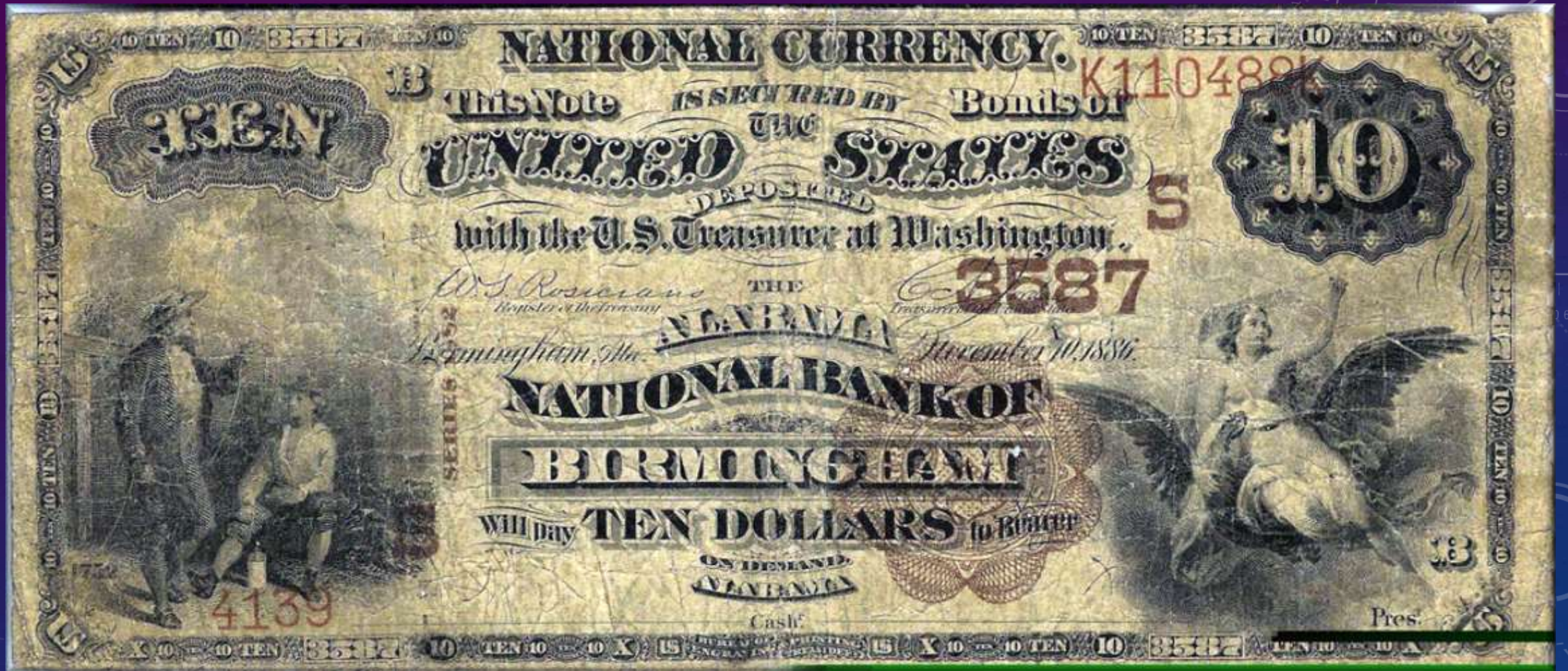

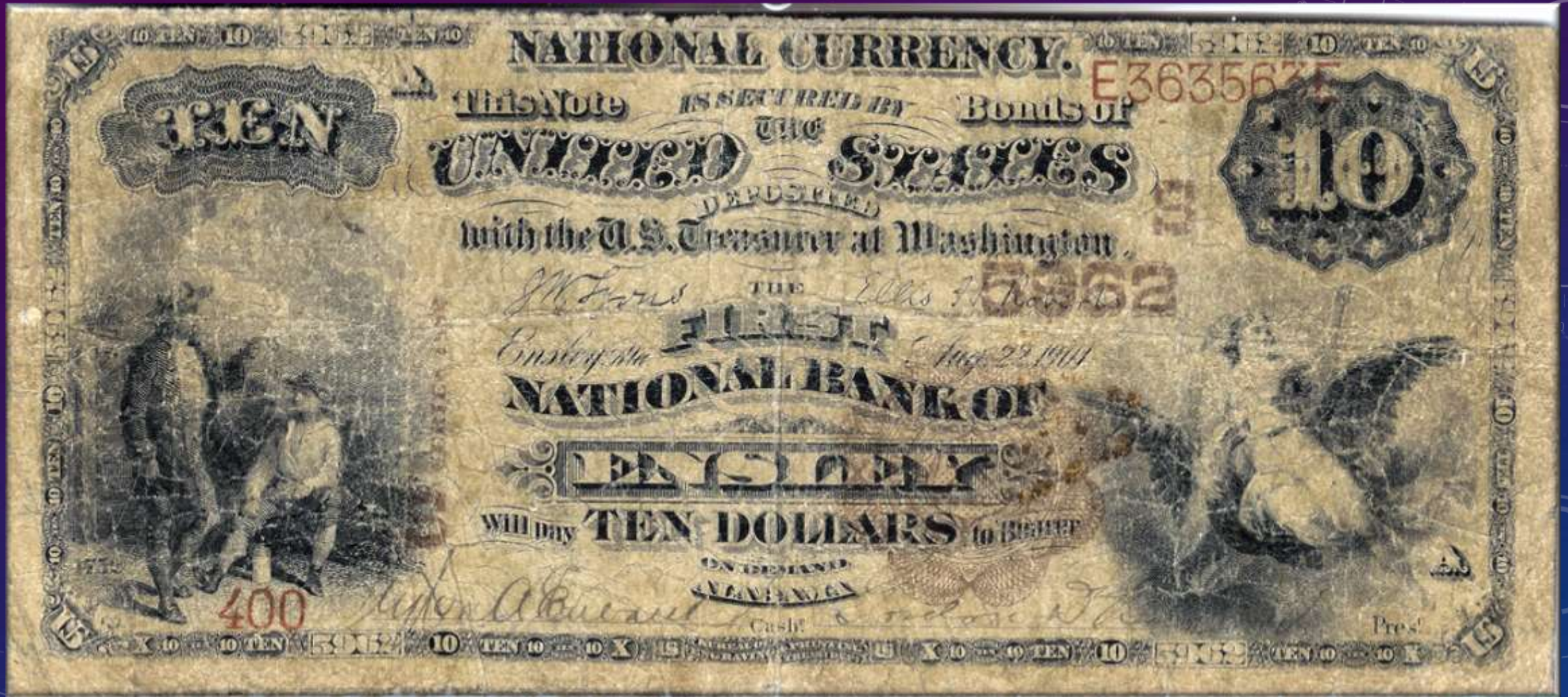

ONE SURVIVOR KNOWN ON THE BANK

- Charter 4393, FNB of Demopolis, One Large Size Note, a \$100 1882 Brown Back, Survives. (One of Nine \$100's Known for Alabama.) (Serial Number 359, Treasury Number B3712476, Plate A, Fine to Very Fine Condition.)
- The Note Belongs to the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta and Is in the Collection of its Birmingham Branch Bank.
- Only Issued 432 Sheets of \$50 and \$100 1882 Brown Backs.
- Liquidated March 9, 1907. \$3,650 Outstanding in 1910.

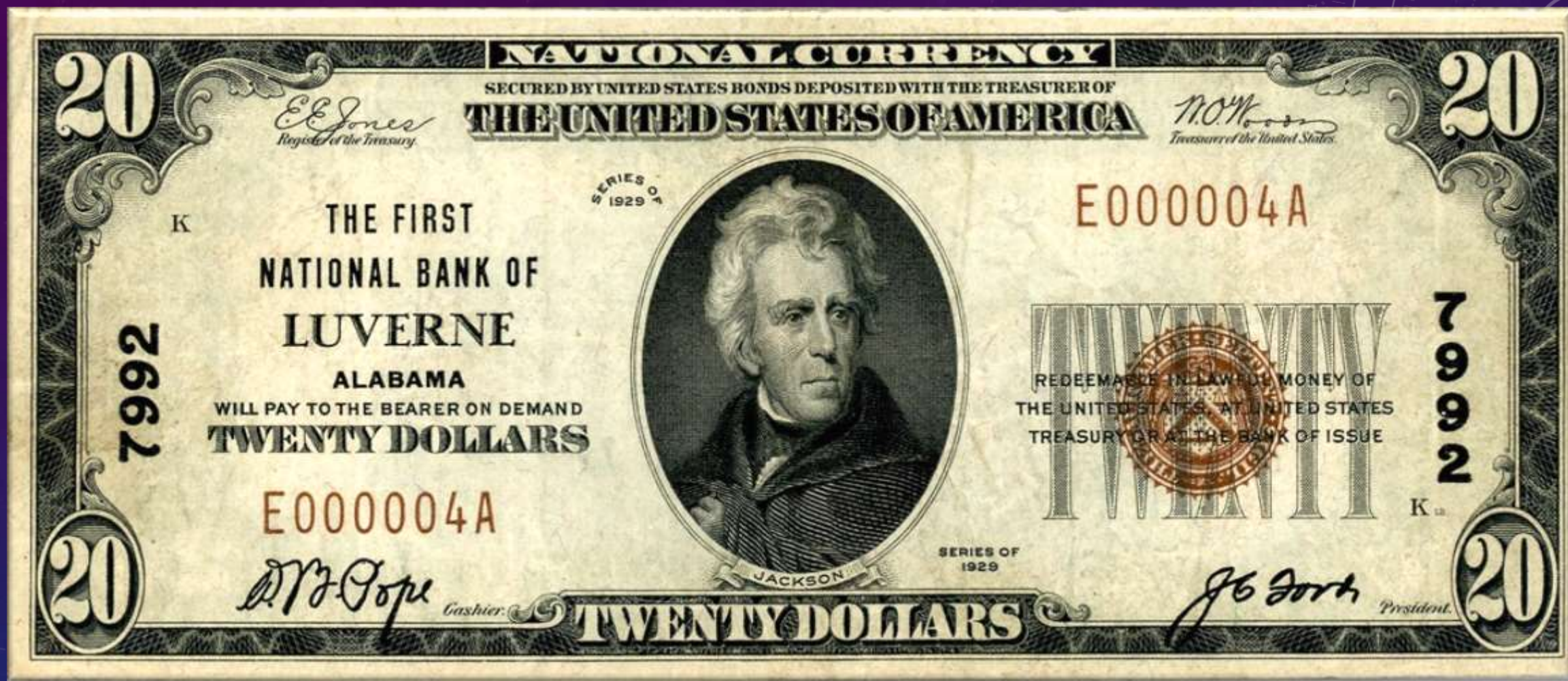

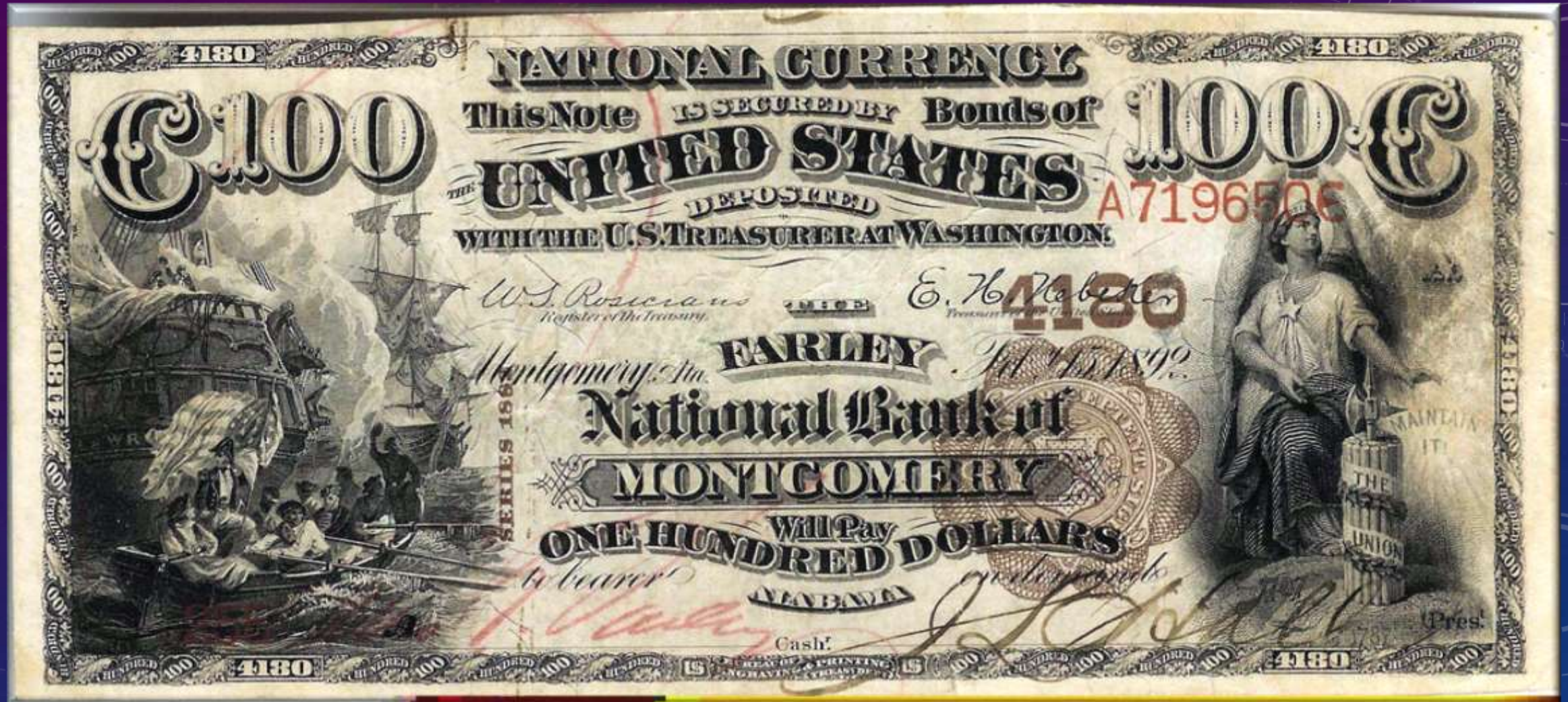

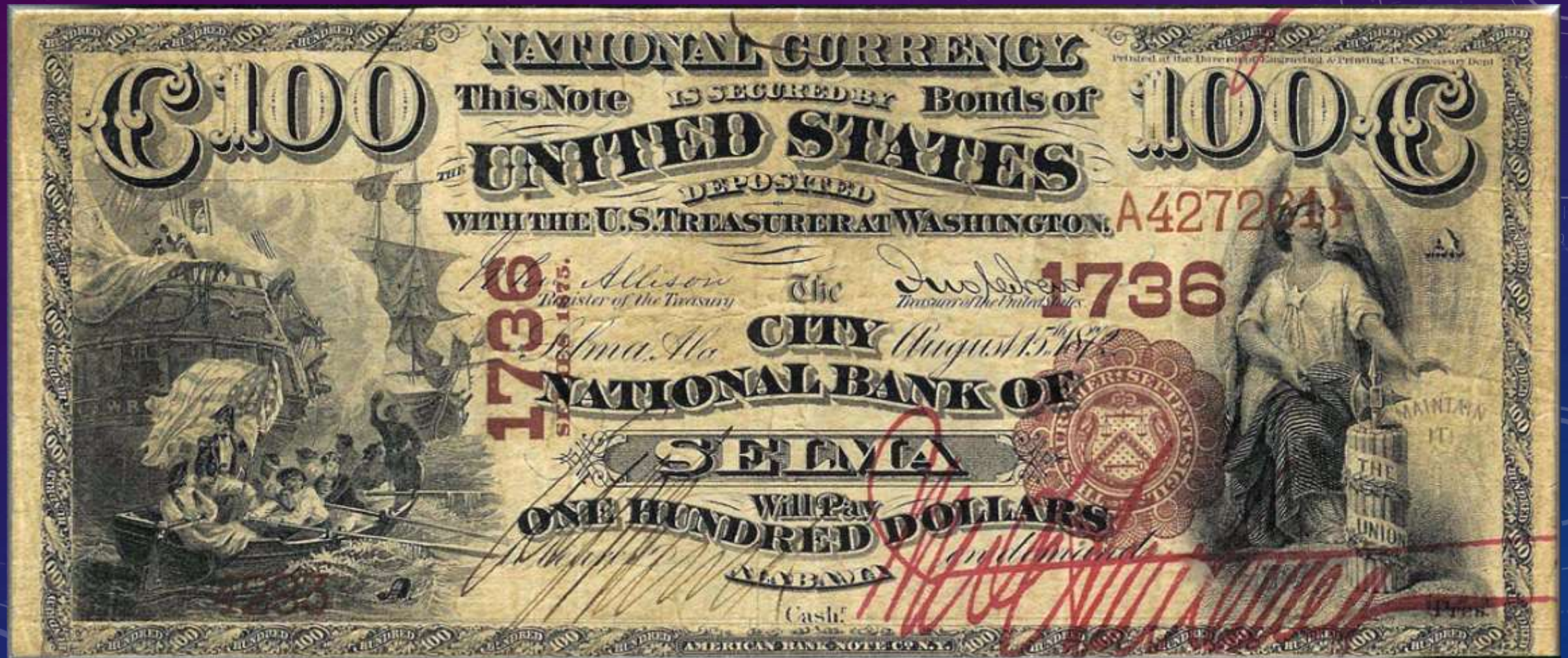

But Only One Issued Series 1875 \$2's.

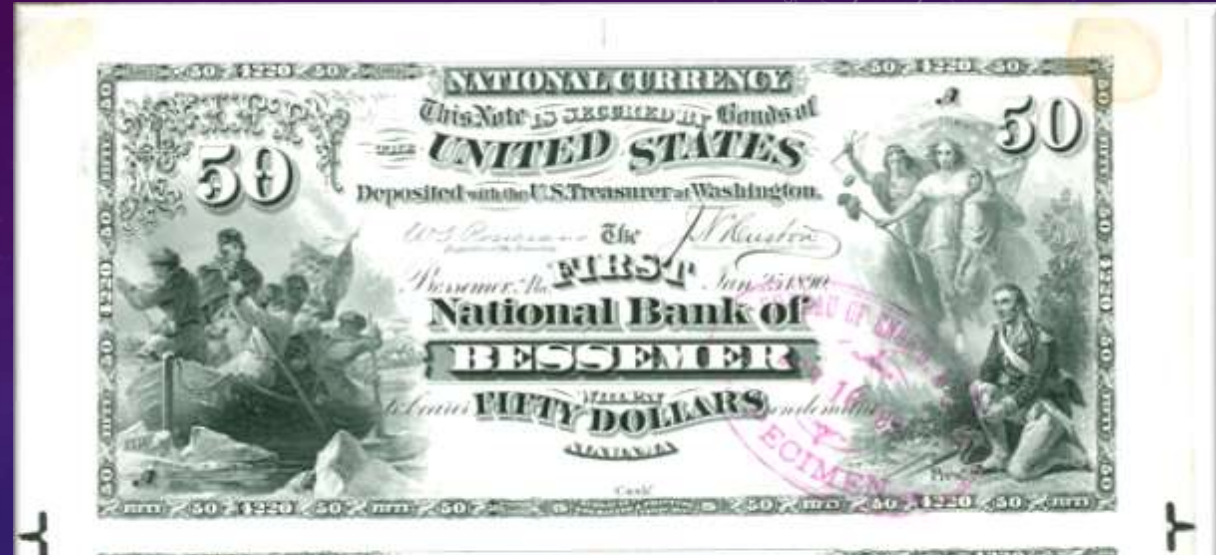

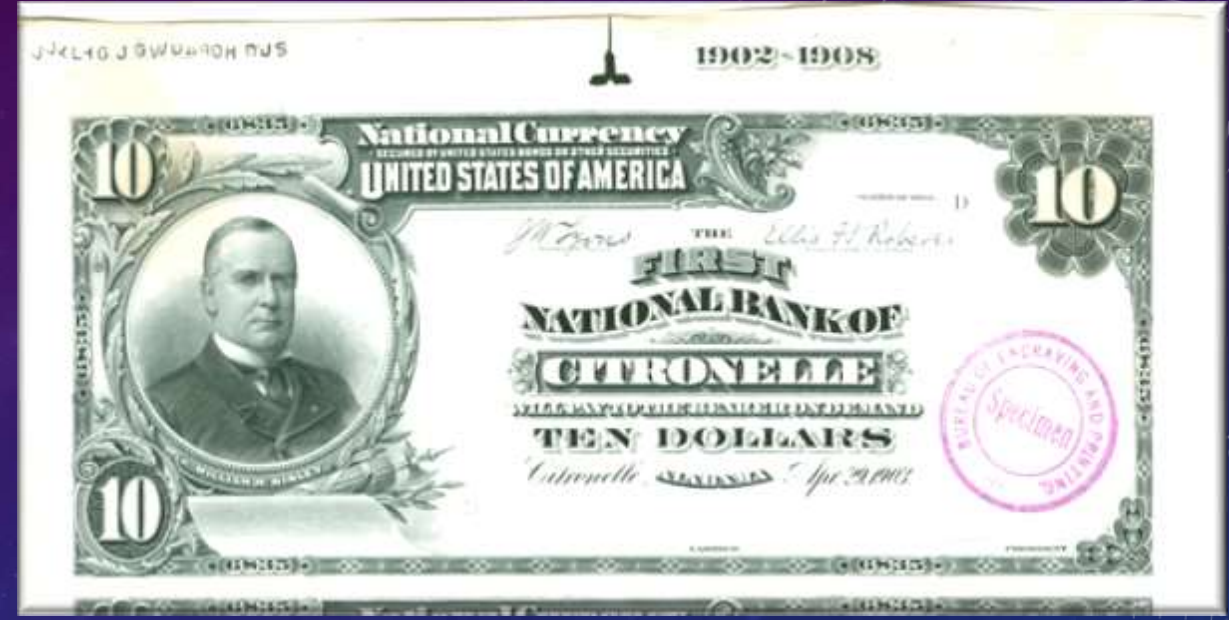
