Has an M Mint Mark for Mexico City Mint.





A common element on all of these coins is the presence of a Palm Tree *privy* mark to the left of the date. This was used to differentiate coins intended for circulation in the colonies from those intended for circulation in the Netherlands which would have an Acorn to the left of the date.







These were struck by the U.S. Mint for the Arabian American Oil Company (Aramco) to pay the Saudi Royal Government the \$3 million a year it owed in oil royalties.

They weigh the exact same amount as the British gold sovereign.
