Christian Gobrecht (1785-1844)

#### Christian Gobrecht

- Chief Engraver at U.S.Mint, 1840-1844
- Offered and declined job as Assistant Engraver in 1823.
- Applied for job as Chief Engraver in December, but job went to William Kneass
- Became "Second Engraver" (de facto Chief) 1935 when Kneass suffered a debilitating stroke
- Succeeded by James Longacre

#### **Mints**

- Half dimes struck at Philadelphia in 1837;
  Philadelphia and New Orleans 1838-1873
- Dimes, quarters, half dollars and dollars struck at various times in Philadelphia, New Orleans, San Francisco and Carson City
- Twenty-cent pieces struck in Philadelphia,
  San Francisco and Carson City
